DC ARMORY HOSTS DC ROLLERGIRLS BOUT SATURDAY

WASHINGTON, D.C. – It may be cold outside but fans can head to the DC Armory for some hot, hard-hitting roller derby action indoors this Saturday!

The DC Rollergirls (DCRG) return to the DC Armory track with a sizzling matchup between the DC DemonCats and Scare Force One, a clash of the league's last two championship teams. Doors open at 3 p.m. and the action begins at 4 p.m.

The 'Cats clawed their way to an 108-93 victory over SFO earlier this season, and currently sit atop the DCRG standings heading into the season's second stanza. With a victory, the defending champion DemonCats are guaranteed a spot in April's league championship bout.

In the expo bout, the Cherry Blossom Bombshells take on Harrisonburg's Rocktown Rollers. At halftime of the main bout, fans can enjoy the unique talents of the **Jim Moyer Circus Club**, a troupe that includes circus acts, unicycles and stilts.

Tickets are \$12 for ages 12 and up, \$6 for children 6-11 and free for kids 5 and under. Tickets are available at www.ticketmaster.com or at the door on bout day. Individuals with a valid military ID can purchase tickets for \$10 at the door.

The DC Armory is easily accessible by the Metro on the Blue and Orange lines (Stadium-Armory station) and numerous bus lines. Secured parking is also available.
