WASHINGTON, D.C. – Summer may be around the corner, but the [DC Rollergirls](#) (DCRG) are bringing the heat to the DC Armory early when the DC All Stars take on the Dominion Derby Girls for a hard-hitting roller derby brawl at the DC Armory May 8! Doors open at 3 p.m. and the action begins at 4 p.m. Fans are encouraged to arrive early for a pre-bout tailgate party in Lot 3 at 1:30 p.m.

The 2010 DC All Stars feature top players from all three DCRG teams who join together to represent the District against teams in the Women's Flat Track Derby Association.

In the expo bout, the Capitol Offenders take on the Lehigh Valley Rollergirls. At halftime of the main bout, fans can enjoy the Greenbelt S.I.T.Y Stars jump rope team.

Tickets are \$12 for ages 12 and up, \$6 for children 6-11 and free for kids 5 and under. Tickets are available at www.ticketmaster.com or at the door on bout day. Individuals with a valid military ID can purchase tickets for \$10 at the door.

The DC Armory is easily accessible by the Metro on the Blue and Orange lines (Stadium-Armory station) and numerous bus lines. Secured parking is also available.
